

John 11:25

Dear Confreres,

In our Province, we have a day of prayer for our deceased MSA USA members on the Saturday following All Souls Day. The passage from the Gospel reminds us of our hope for immortality. The temporality and eternity is part of our faith; to be "a true-believer" (Fr. Jose Salazar) means to have hope in the Resurrection, to expect to be raised by Jesus on the last day. Our Constitutions reminds us of this reality. He called us to give witness that life doesn't end with our corporal mortality. So, in our family MSA USA, we honor the memory of those who gave their lives for the cause of the Kingdom of God every year on the first Saturday after All Souls Day, starting with the Table of the Eucharist, continuing by sharing the food of fraternity, and by ending with a visit in the cemetery with prayers and intercessions for their souls, expressing our hope of eternal life. For us, eternal life is a reality in some way mysterious where the Church Glorified, Suffering, and Itinerant, is emphasized. For many of us MSA, earthly life

seems short, when we see its challenges and joys in front of us, we are hoping for eternity and when we look back to our personal history, the many years lived in apostlic mission seem like yesterday and it's gone. When we see our lives in front of us, we have hope for eternity and when we look back to many years lived in apostolic mission, it seems like yesterday and it is gone. For this reason, it is important to live the present time; yesterday is past and tomorrow is in the hands of God. Let us, even with our weakening strength, continue to throw the nets into the ocean of hope trying to catch the vocations which God sends to our MSA USA family in order to contuinue our charism and mission in the Church: to give priests to make present the hope of humanity, Jesus Christ, the Crucified, the Risen, and the Lord. And let us keep in mind that Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever, and if we are faithful until the end, we will be with him forever. Grant them eternal rest, and let the light of the Lord shine on them. Amen. Alleluia.

From 2015 and 2016, five of our brothers have returned to the House of our Heavenly Father. Their lives were well appreciated. They exercised their ministry in different fields. One served in the Seminary and at the service of his Province; others helping in different dioceses and parishes, serving different faithful of different cultures and languages, with one unique mission: to help them to walk in the holiness of life and in finding priestly vocations. Now, we are sure, from the eternal home they will continue to intercede for us during our pilgrimage on earth, and their supplication will be heard by God, helping us to have abundant vocations at the service of our charism and mission in the Church. This necrology will help us to know a little who they were:

The 2016 Necrology

Rev. Fr. George Realmuto, MSA, was born on March 4, 1933, of Salvator Realmuto and Mildred Fiore. He was baptized on March 26, 1933, and made his Definitive Promise on April 24, 1987. Father George was ordained to the transitional diaconate on April 27, 1987, and to the holy priesthood on August 29, 1987. After his studies in psychology and in Canon Law, He served in our Seminary, Holy Apostles. He spent the last years of his priesthood in retirement. He passed into the Father's House on October 10, 2016. **Rev. Fr. Richard Skarbek, MSA**, was born on July 2, 1932, of Julian Skarbek and Mary Plecka, in Brooklyn, NY. He was baptized on the day of his birth, July 2, 1932. He was ordained to the transitonal diaconate on April 16, 1985, and was ordained a priest by His Holiness Pope John Paul II. Father Richard was for all of his priestly life serving in the seminary at the service of his Province MSA USA. He passed into the Father's House on June 22, 2016.

Rev. Fr. Jose Salazar, MSA, was born of Alfonso Salazar and Encarnacion Solis in New York on January 12, and was baptized on June 12, 1937. Father Jose worked in Holy Apostles College and Seminary, where he taught Moral Theology and where he was Dean of Men. Afterwards, he did ministry in the Dioceses of Hartford, Arlington (Virginia), and D.C. where he worked faithfully to promote, form, and accompany vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Father Jose even wrote and published a top-notch theological book: *The True Believer*. He passed into the Father's House March 6, 2016.

Rev. Fr. Robert Burk, MSA, was born in Ambridge, PA, of Joseph Burk and Mary Turon, on September 7, 1943, and, following his graduation from West Penn Nursing School in Pittsburgh, PA, he served our country for twenty-six (26) years and retired as a colonel in the U.S. Army. Father Bob made his Definitive Promise on March 26, 2003. He was ordained to the transitional diaconate on April 5, 2003, and to the holy priesthood on November 22, 2003. He was formerly pastor of St. Michael the Archangel/Mary Mother of Peace parish in Georgetown, DE, and Millsboro, DE, passed into the Father's House on May 5, 2016.

Rev. Fr. Francis Joseph Fajella, MSA, was born of Frank Joseph Fajella and Margaret Orlando on October 30, 1937. He made his Definitive Promise on January 15, 1982 and was instituted as Lector/Acolyte on August 15, 1972. He was ordained to the transitional diaconate on January 20, 1982, and to the holy priesthood on March 14, 1982. Father Frank started his ministry in Holy Apostles College and Seminary. He was a formator. After that, he spent the remainder of his ministry time in the Archdiocese of New York. He passed into the Father's House on September 5, 2015.
